- Practices: 2 practices before first game, weekly practice after first game
- Game Location: Monroe County YMCA field
- Games: 8 game scheduled played on Saturday
- Game times will vary between 9am and 1pm
- Individual entry only
- Ball: 8.5 inch youth sized (soft) ball
- Teams consists of no more than 10 players
- 3 inning games
- All players bat each inning
- No strikeouts
- All players reach base
- No leadoffs or stealing
- Player position rotation strongly encouraged
- Batting helmets required

Additional Coach Pitch Rules

- Team roster maximum of 14 players
- 7 pitch per batter maximum
- Ball placed on tee after 7th pitch
- Outs count, 3 outs per inning
- No walks or strikeouts
- 8 runs maximum per inning
- No running into catcher
- Free substitution

Additional Player Pitch Rules

- Ball: Standard sized (hard) ball
- Strikeouts and walks count
